WHY CUT Down on Salt use?

Most of the road salt (sodium chloride) or other chemicals that are applied to melt ice and snow, either in solid or liquid form, ends up contaminanting our streams, lakes, and groundwater. **Once road salt is dissolved, there is no practical way to remove the chlorides from water resources.**
