
# Water Supply Sustainability Plan overview



#### Purpose:

Develop a water supply sustainability plan for the NWPA region.

- 24 months, started in January 2023
- Funded by the Illinois Department of Natural Resources
- Project partners NWPA (TAC and EC),
   Illinois-Indiana Sea Grant (IISG)







#### Plan objectives:

- Establish water sustainability goals
- Identify voluntary, feasible, and effective strategies NWPA members can take
- Build greater municipal awareness of priority strategies and resources
- Serve as a template to guide local planning efforts






#### What it is...

- Voluntary
- Broad potential water savings estimates for the NWPA region, not focused on any one municipality
- Raises awareness of the need for action and provides steps

#### What it is not...

- Does not establish any new or broader regulatory authority
- Does not address unique conditions and issues facing individual municipalities
- Some locations may need to conserve more water
- Local governments, particularly in risk areas, will still need to develop their own local plans





#### Plan outcomes

- A shared vision
- Broad potential water savings recommendations to promote the long-term sustainability of the water supply sources used by NWPA communities

"The NWPA water supply sustainability plan will serve as a roadmap for members seeking to take voluntary steps toward feasible and effective long-term use of water supply resources."

#### **NWPA Mission Statement:**

The NWPA, formed by intergovernmental agreement, seeks to collaboratively plan for and steward our shared river and groundwater resources to ensure a sustainable water supply for the people, economy, environment, and future generations.

#### **NWPA Vision Statement:**

The NWPA area will have dependable supplies of water for generations to come.










# How much water is used to grow a watermelon?



**Lake Michigan**: NWPA communities needing an alternative water source will have access to a sufficient, affordable, and safe water supply within the legal limits of Illinois' Lake Michigan allocation.


**Fox River:** The Fox River will provide NWPA communities with an affordable, safe, and reliable water supply while sustaining aquatic ecosystems.

**Sandstone:** Water withdrawals will be managed at a rate that extends the life of the deep aquifers and gives NWPA communities experiencing adverse dewatering impacts adequate time to switch water sources.

**Shallow**: Shallow aquifers will provide NWPA communities and households with an affordable, safe, and sufficient water supply while supporting healthy aquatic ecosystems.






# Do you agree with the Fox River goal?



#### Fox River goal:


"The Fox River will provide NWPA communities with an affordable, safe, and reliable water supply while sustaining aquatic ecosystems."

#### Sandstone aquifer goal:




# Do you agree with the shallow aquifer goal?
